Community Priorities

Priority #1: Traffic - Speeding**Updates and Comments:**

During this Quarter, there were 55 reports of Speeding-related offences resulting in 34 charges and 6 reports of Intersection-related offences resulting in 4 charges being laid. As well, 4 Seatbelt offence charges, 4 Other Moving Traffic Violation charges, 19 Non-Moving Violation charges, and 1 charge for Driving While Disqualified or with a Suspended License. In total, there were 163 Traffic-related offences reported resulting in 66 charges and 31 warnings.

This Objective has been exceeded with one more Quarter remaining.

Priority #2: Crime Reduction - Property Crime**Updates and Comments:**

During this Quarter, 17 Condition Checks were conducted, primarily on High Risk Property Offenders on court or member-imposed conditions. As a result, 2 persons were found to not be abiding certain conditions resulting in arrests and applicable charges being laid.

This Objective is on-track and should be exceeded by the next Quarter.

Priority #3: Police / Community Relations - Police Visibility**Updates and Comments:**



During this Quarter, 3 Foot Patrols were conducted within the Community of Claresholm, primarily involving Licensed establishments. Also, 3 dedicated Rural Patrols were undertaken, primarily in the area of the Claresholm Airport and the Porcupine Hills (MD of Willow Creek). As well, members have continued with patrols through local communities and MD's.

Priority #4: Substance Abuse - Drug

Updates and Comments:

During this Quarter, 4 reports were received of possible offences under the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act, however, due to limited information provided, which was anonymously, little action could be taken by the members. 3 monthly Media Releases (1 per month) were submitted to local media outlining the Detachments calls for service as well as Public Service Advisories noting current crime trends relating to Fraud and the Theft prevention, amongst other local issues. Objective has been exceeded, however, no formal presentations have been conducted or requested from any stakeholders, ie: local schools or other organizations.
