Community Priorities

Priority #1: Traffic - Speeding**Updates and Comments:**

46 Speeding infractions were reported during this final Quarter, resulting in 26 charges being laid and 13 Written Warnings issued. There were also 5 intersection-related offences reported resulting in 1 charge being laid and 3 Written Warning issued. In total, 131 Traffic-related offences were reported resulting in 62 charges being laid and 29 Warnings issued.

Overall, this has been a successful initiative.

Priority #2: Crime Reduction - Property Crime**Updates and Comments:**

During this Quarter, only 2 Conditions Checks were completed with both being compliant. It was recently announced that the Crown has become opposed to Curfew Checks being done, or charges being laid, if persons were found being non-compliant.

Currently, Claresholm Detachment has several persons on various court-imposed conditions, some of which have curfew conditions.

Claresholm also has persons on Warrant status, some of whom no longer reside in the detachment area or of no fixed address. There are 8 persons possibly residing in the Claresholm area Wanted by other jurisdictions.





Priority #3: Police / Community Relations - Police Visibility

Updates and Comments:

Foot patrols and regular vehicle patrols continue to be conducted throughout the communities and Municipal Districts. Monthly Media Releases have been commenced soon after the Non-commissioned Officer (NCO) in-charge took his position in Claresholm. Feedback from the community has been very favorable. As well, Media Releases sent from Strategic Communications citing a variety of Crime Reduction and Public Advisory topics have also been submitted through the local media.

Priority #4: Substance Abuse - Drug

Updates and Comments:

Only 1 offence under the *Controlled Drugs and Substances Act* was reported over this quarter. An investigation revealed no evidence of any drug activity.
